9.1 Campus Rules

- While attending College functions, the students will conduct themselves in such a way as to bring credit to themselves and to the institution.
- Spitting,smoking,chewinggumandthrowingbitsofpaperinsidethecollegecampusis prohibited.
- Students are prohibited from damaging the building or any other property of the College
 in any way. The cost of any damage so caused will be recovered from the students
 collectively if the responsibility for it cannot be fixed on any individual or group of
 individuals.
- Representation of complaints and grievances may be made individually to the HoD concerned

- No notice of any kind shall be circulated among students or displayed on black boards or
 on notice board without the written permission of the principal. No information or report
 should be sent to press or broadcasting agencies without the permission and approval of

- Misconduct during examination, production of false information or documents for admission purpose and the failure to return loaned materials or settling debts with the College would be seriously dealt with.

9.5 OutsideCampus. Useofcampusresources

- Institution resources must be reserved for business purposes on behalf of the Institution.
 They may not be used for personal gain except in a manner that is incidental, and reasonable in light of
- the person's duties. Institution resources include, but are not limited to, the use of Institutionsystems, suchastelephonesystems, datacommunication and networking systems, and the domain for electronic communication
- forums; the use of Institution equipment; the use of procurement tools such as purchasing cards, credit cards, and petty cash; and the time and effort of other staff, students, and others at the Institution.
- Appropriate use of Institution property and information requires that persons not use a
 password, access a file, or retrieve any stored communication without authorization. This
 includes concealing, falsifying, altering, misusing, or removing records, including electronic
 records. In addition, information such as mailing lists of students,
- employees, or alumni must not be given to anyone without authorization from the Unit Executive.
- Any member of the K-Community using institution resources may not solicit others for commercialventures, religious or political causes, outside organizations, or other noninstitution matters

9.6 GeneralBehavior

- All members of the K-Community are responsible for sustaining the highest ethical standards of the institute, and of the broader communities in which it functions by adhering to the code of conduct. The institute values honesty,
- trust, fairness, respect and responsibility and strives to integrate these values into its teaching, research and business practices. It is the intent of the Code of Conduct to maintainEthicsandtoprotectacademicfreedom,acollegialatmosphereforteachingand scholarship and to advance the mission of the institution.
- TheStudentCodeofConductpromoteshonesty,integrity,accountability,rights and responsibilities associated with being a constructive member of the K-community.

9.7 ICCPolicy

- KCLASwillnottoleratesexualharassmentunderanycircumstances.Responsibilitylieswith every member of the KCommunity to ensure that sexual harassment does not occur.
- Thispolicyappliestoconductthattakesplaceinanyinstitution-relatedcontext,including conferences, work functions, social events and business trips.
- No employee or volunteer at any level should subject any other employee, volunteer, customerorvisitortoanyformofsexualharassment.

- Abreachofthispolicywillresultindisciplinaryaction, uptoandincluding termination of work/studywith KCLAS
- KCLAS strongly encourages any employee who feels they have been sexually harassed to
 take immediate action. If an employee or volunteer feels comfortable in doing so, it is
 preferable to raise the issue with the person directly with a view to resolving the issue by
 discussion. The employee or volunteer should identify the harassing behaviour, explain
 that the behaviour is unwelcome and offensive and ask that the behaviour stops.
- Alternatively, or in addition, they may report the behaviour in accordance with the relevantprocedure. Onceareportisma detheorganisation has the right to determine how the report should be dealt with in accordance with its obligations and this policy.
- Any reports of sexual harassment will be treated seriously and promptly with sensitivity.
 Such reports will be treated as completely confidential up to the point where a formal or informalcomplaintislodgedagainstaparticularperson, at which point that personmust be notified under the rules of natural justice.
- Complainantshavetherighttodeterminehowtohaveacomplainttreated, tohave support or representation throughout the process, and the option to discontinue a complaint at any stage of the process.
- The alleged harasser also has the right to have support or representation during any
 investigation, as well as the right to respond fully to any formal allegations made. There
 willbenopresumptionsofguiltandnodeterminationmadeuntilafullinvestigationhas been
 completed.
- No employee or volunteer will be treated unfairly as a result of rejecting unwanted advances. Disciplinary action may be taken against anyone who victimizes or retaliates againstapersonwhohascomplainedofsexualharassment,oragainstanyemployeeor volunteer who has been alleged to be a harasser.

9.8 InstitutionalRulesAbuse Dishonestbehaviour

 All forms of dishonesty, including cheating, plagiarism, and supplying false information, as wellasforgeryoruseofdocumentsorinstrumentsofidentificationwithintenttomislead or defraud, is prohibited.

Disruptivebehaviour

Engaging in, or inciting others to engage in, conduct which disturbs the peace of the
institute, involves a significant disruption of institute activity, or impedes reasonable
freedom of expression or movement of other members of the Kcommunity or its guests is
prohibited.

Driving(recklessly)

 Driving or parking on campus sidewalks or prohibited areas is not allowed. Students must park their vehicles only in the student parking area.

Possessionoruseoffireworksisprohibitedinthecampus.

Unauthorizedentry

 Unauthorized entry, use or occupation of institution's facilities; as well as theunauthorizedpossession, duplication or use of keystoany institution facility is prohibited.

Non-residencehall

 Incidentsandviolationsthatoccuroutsidetheresidencehalls,includingoffcampus,are referreddirectlytotheheadofstudentcenter.

9.9 SubstanceAbuseAlcohol andotherdrugsuse

- KCLAS is a dry institution. Possession, consumption, being under the influence of, or
 the providing of beverages containing alcohol or the possession of alcoholic beverage
 containers, eitherfullorempty, on property ownedors upervised by the institution is
 prohibited. Disruptive or disrespectful behavior, property damage, or personal
- harassment as a consequence of alcohol consumption is also prohibited. Any person, regardless of age, found in violation of the alcohol policy is subject to KCLAS' disciplinary system.
- The possession, use, sale, manufacturing, or distribution of illicit drugs and/ or drug paraphernalia is a violation of the law and is prohibited. Disruptive or disrespectful behavior, property damage or personal harassment as a consequence
- ofillicitdrugsorcontrolledsubstancesisstrictlyprohibited. Anyperson found inviolation of this
 policy will be subject to the institution's disciplinary system which could include
 suspension or dismissal and may be reported to the
- appropriate local or state authorities. The institution, historically, has attempted to
 influence positively, the whole person-mind, body, and spirit. Consistent with that goal,
 the institution has resolved to support definitive actions designed to assist students and
 employees striving to cope with problems related to the use of alcohol and drugs.

Tobacco

Tobacco use is discouraged as a basic principle of good health. The University will not
toleratesmokingtotheextentofinconveniencetothenon-smoker. Smoking, including
e-cigarettesandvaping, or use of smokeless to baccoand hook a hswill not be permitted in any of
the buildings owned or used by the institution.

9.10 PeopleAbuse

Hazing

- Hazing means any intentional, knowing, or reckless act occurring on or off campus. No
 individual of the K-community will be allowed to perform acts of Hazing.

- Any type of physical activity, such as sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, calisthenics, or other activity that subjects the student to an unreasonable risk of harm or that adversely affects the mental or physical health or safety of the student
- Any activity involving consumption of a food, liquid, alcoholic beverage, liquor, drug,or
 other substance that subjects the student to an unreasonable risk of harm or which
 adversely affects the mental or physical health or safety of the student.
- Any activity that intimidates or threatens the student with ostracism, that subjects the
 student to extreme mental stress, shame, or humiliation, or that adversely affects the
 mental health or dignity of the student or discourages the student from entering or
 remaining registered in an educational institution, or that may reasonably be expected
 tocauseastudenttoleavetheorganizationortheinstitutionratherthatsubmittoacts
 described in this subsection.
- Any activity that induces, causes, or requires the student to perform a duty or task which involves a violation of the Penal Code. A person commits an offense if the person:
 - Engagesinhazing.
 - Solicits, encourages, directs, aidsorattempts to aid another in engaging in hazing.
 - Intentionally, knowingly or recklessly permits hazing to occur.
- Has firsthand knowledge of the planning of a specific hazing incident involving a student
 in an educational institution, or firsthand knowledge that a specific hazing incident has
 occurred, and knowingly fails to reports aid knowledge to the Office of Student Affairs or other
 appropriate of ficial of the institution.
- Anorganizationcommitsanoffenseiftheorganizationcondonesorencourageshazing or if an officer or any combination of members, pledges or alumni of the organization commits or assists in the commission of hazing.
- The act of "hazing" is not consistent with the mission or philosophy of the institute and will not be accepted as appropriate behavior. Students and/or student organizations who commit a "hazing" incident will face disciplinary action according to the discipline system.

Misusingortamperingwithfire-fightingequipmentorsafetyequipmentisprohibited. Fire
extinguishers on campus contain a chemical dry powder. If they are discharged, cleaning
is expensive and if a person is sprayed, it can be very dangerous; the powder can cause
blindness and burn the skin. Any- one who carelessly injures another person by playing
with or is discharging a fire extinguisher shall be held directly responsible for any material
damages and/or personal injuries (self or other).

Theft

 Theft of, or damage to, the property of another person of the institute; as well asreceiving, retaining or disposing of the lost or mislaid property of another person or of the institute is prohibited. If students find a potentially lost item, it should be returned to the student centre.

TechnologyAbuse

- ProtectionofIntellectualPropertyRights(IPR)
- The institution complies with all laws regulating intellectual property rights, including
 copyright infringement, confidential information and software privacy. Each member
